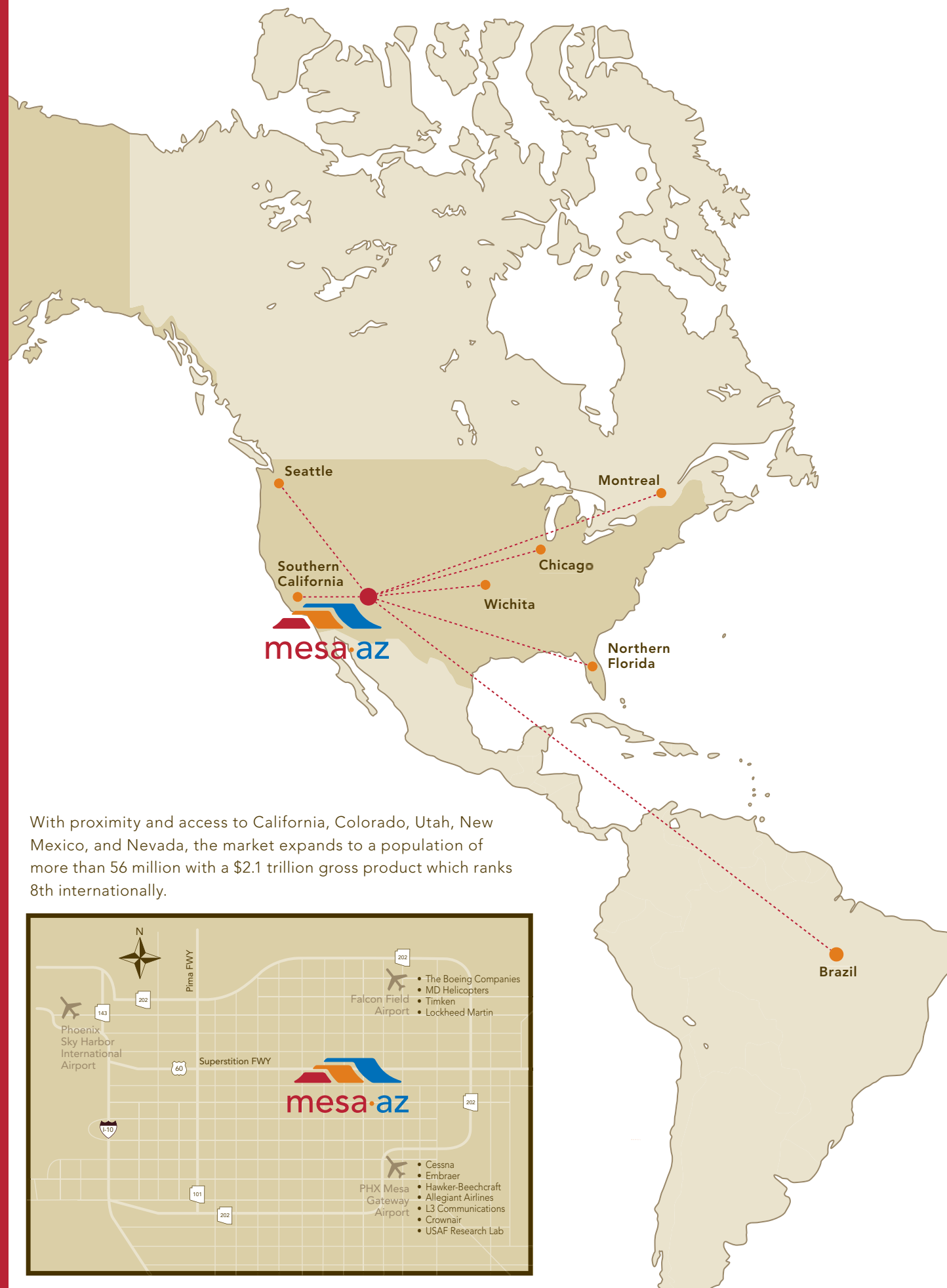

Mesa's Airports Anchor Top Companies and Developments

Mesa boasts two airports: Mesa Falcon Field Airport and Phoenix Mesa Gateway Airport. Each offers a diverse portfolio of aerospace, defense, aviation and other high tech industries, plus the operations to support those such as MRO, cargo and R&D activities.

- > More than 100 companies are adjacent to the airports employing more than 10,000 employees in aerospace/aviation, high-tech, manufacturing, and software industry clusters
- > Excellent access to freeways within one mile of each airport and rail is in close proximity
- > More than \$100 million in new infrastructure development is scheduled for completion by end of 2015



PHX-MESA GATEWAY AIRPORT (IWA)

- > In 2009, IWA served 600,000 passengers and is projected to grow to two to five million by 2030
- > IWA provides an attractive alternative to Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport
- > Allegiant Air currently flies out of IWA to 20 destinations in the US
- > 300 acres available for development with 10,400, 10,200, and 9,300 foot runways
- > US Customs Service on-site
- > Last year, IWA handled 264,085 aircraft operations and delivered 8.3 million gallons of aviation fuel
- > FAA-Contract Air Traffic Control Tower



Incentives for Key Sectors

Programs and Incentives for qualifying businesses continue to attract high-tech sectors to Mesa:

- > Mesa stands out as a city that does not have a primary property tax, resulting in significant savings to companies compared to other cities in and outside Arizona
- > **Foreign Trade Zone** benefits reduce real and personal property tax by nearly 80% and other cost saving benefits
- > **Military Reuse Zone** reduces property tax by nearly 80% and offers income tax credit for new employees
- > **Job Training** programs exist at the state, region and local levels and can be customized based on the project. Contact the City of Mesa for additional details.

Talented Workforce at Competitive Wages

- > The State of Arizona is a right-to-work state with a low level of unionization
- > Arizona labor wage rates are 14% below the national average
- > Workers compensation and unemployment insurance (payroll taxes) are lower than any other state in the Western region and lower than 92% of all jurisdictions in the US
- > Skilled talent, easy to attract and retain workforce

Arizona has a progressive business environment that is supported locally in the City of Mesa. Recent legislation has continued to improve the operating environment for businesses with:

- > Property tax reductions
- > New corporate tax structure that benefits firms in Arizona doing business outside of the state

- > FFZ is the fourth busiest general aviation airport in the USA and second busiest general aviation airport in the Phoenix Metro area
- > More than 900 aircraft are based at FFZ with more than 300,000 flight operations annually
- > Six industrial parks are spread throughout the Business District and provide a wide range of options suitable for nearly any operation and provide over 1,000 acres of industrial-zoned lands
